School and Grade Level Communication in VERACROSS



Veracross is a comprehensive school information management system that will enable you to effectively monitor your child's education and activities, along with our school information and calendar.

Homeroom assignments and schedules will be available for viewing in our Veracross student/parent information portal during the first week of August.

NEW FAMILIES: *New parents will receive access to the parent portal before the start of the school year. You will use your current Veracross account which you created during the admissions process. If there is a parent in the household who does not currently have a Veracross account, the parent will receive an email with an invitation to set up access (username/password) for your Veracross parent account. Please watch for that important email. The email will generate from the following email address: system@mail.veracross.com.*

New students in grades 6 - 12 will receive log in information for their new Veracross student accounts after school has started.

Once you log in to your Veracross account, you will be able to view your child's homeroom class assignment, class schedules, our school calendar, etc., as well as pay tuition online, access your Westfield account balance, etc. It is crucial that you keep your family profile current—address, phone numbers and e-mail addresses as all emergency text alerts, school newsletters, and other communication are directed to these numbers and addresses. Please update your contact information in Veracross if needed.

Lower School: Lower School faculty is expected to post all grades in Veracross. Homework assignments and key dates are communicated through a weekly flyer that each teacher creates and sends home every Friday in the students' "Friday Folders" which also contains all student work from the week. In addition to the Friday Folders, students in 1st grade – 5th grade also use daily agendas. The agendas provide a great opportunity for teachers to work with students to record homework and test assignments, teaching students to be responsible for taking notes and collecting books needed.

Middle and Upper School: Middle School faculty (Grades 6 – 8) and Upper School faculty (grades 9 – 12) are expected to post all grades in Veracross. Students in grades 6 – 12 are issued a school-based e-mail address and their own Veracross log-in. Their Veracross log-in accesses the student platform of Veracross where they will see class schedules, along with other information. Parents keep their own separate Veracross log-in that accesses the parent platform.

Lower School Dress Code for 2024-2025

BOYS' DRESS CODE

- ✓ Collared or crew neck shirts
- ✓ Shirts must be tucked in
- ✓ Pants and jeans without holes or frays, neat, clean and hemmed
- ✓ Belt must be worn with shorts or pants that have belt loops
- ✓ Shorts no shorter than 3 inches above knee
- ✓ Shoes or boots with enclosed toes and heels
- ✓ Sandals and Crocs style shoes must be worn with a heel strap

BOYS' HAIR

- ✓ Hair should not be below the bottom of the ear, not below the eyebrow nor extend below the top of the collar.

GIRLS' DRESS CODE

- ✓ Collared or crew neck shirts (no v-neck)
- ✓ Short or long-sleeved (not sleeveless) shirts and dresses
- ✓ Shirts may be worn untucked if designed to be worn untucked and if it is of sufficient length to cover midriff and waist at all times
- ✓ Pants and jeans without holes or frays, neat, clean and hemmed
- ✓ Dresses, skirts, skorts, and shorts must be appropriate length
- ✓ Leggings may only be worn with a dress
- ✓ Shoes or boots with enclosed toes and heels
- ✓ Sandals and Crocs style shoes must be worn with a heel strap

ITEMS NOT ALLOWED FOR BOYS OR GIRLS

- T-shirts
- Pictures, emblems or lettering on clothes
- Logos larger than a 2-inch square
- Sleeveless shirts and undershirts as a shirt
- Shirts with writing
- Athletic shirts, shorts, pants, or sweat pants
- Fad haircuts or hair colors
- Camouflage clothing
- Shoes or boots with more than a 1-inch heel
- Shoes with wheels
- Boots worn with shorts
- Flip Flops
- Slides
- Cold shoulder shirts
- Sweatshirts/hoodies that are not WESTFIELD

FRIDAY SPIRIT DAYS

- ✓ Students may wear Westfield game jerseys, cheer uniforms, or Westfield t-shirts on Fridays only.

OUTER WEAR FOR BOYS AND GIRLS

- ✓ Sweatshirts and hoodies (Westfield only) may be worn over a collared shirt (or over a Westfield t-shirt on Friday spirit days). No other sweatshirts/hoodies may be worn.
- ✓ Solid color pullovers and vests (such as Patagonia, Columbia, Vineyard Vines, etc.) over a collared shirt may be worn.
- ✓ Jackets and coats without any wording may be worn.
- ✓ **Camouflage outerwear items are not allowed.**
- ✓ Westfield approved items from Lands' End (with or without the Westfield monogram) and our online Spirit Shop/Graphic Guys may be worn.

UNIFORM WEAR

Uniform clothing is not required for Lower School students (Pre-K - 5th Grade). However, students in Lower School may purchase and wear to school any of the items on the approved lists for The Westfield School through Lands' End and our online Spirit Shop (Graphic Guys).

Middle & Upper School Dress Code for 2024-2025

MIDDLE & UPPER SCHOOL BOYS

Shirts: Shirts must be traditional button down (with buttoned collars), oxford/cotton, cotton-blend, or similar fabric dress shirt, solid color, stripes, or plaids, long or short sleeves, with no more than top button unbuttoned, or collared polo-type shirt, solid color or stripe, long or short sleeves, with no more than top button unbuttoned; or mock turtleneck or turtleneck. Logos must be no larger than 2" square. Shirts may not be worn as jackets. Shirts must be tucked in at all times on campus (from morning arrival to end of school bell).

Pants: Pants must be solid color or seersucker, and normal fit, without elasticized or draw-string waist; must be neat, clean, and hemmed; must not contain holes, frays, or patches. Belts must be worn with pants which have belt loops. All pants must fit properly and modestly.

Jeans: Jeans must be solid color and normal fit, without elasticized or draw-string waist; must be neat, clean, and hemmed, must not contain holes, frays, or patches. Jeans must not have any distressed finish (tears, holes, cuts,) and washes or fading must not be extreme. Fad finishes are not allowed. Jeans may be unhemmed but must not be torn or have loose threads at hem. Belts must be worn with jeans which have belt loops. All jeans must fit properly and modestly.

Shorts: Shorts must be walking or Bermuda style shorts; must be solid color or seersucker, and normal fit, without elasticized or draw-string waist; must be neat, clean, and hemmed; must not contain holes, frays, or patches. All shorts must fit properly and modestly.

Footwear: Shoes and boots must have closed toes; all boots must be worn with pants leg over boot top, not tucked in boots (pants should be boot cut design - fabric should not be cut in order to fit over boots); lace-type boots must be worn with laces fully tied, boots may not be worn with shorts. Toe shoes, sport sandals, slides, house slippers, shower shoes, and flip-flops are not allowed. Crocs style shoes are allowed.

Not Allowed: Camouflage items/clothing; athletic shorts; hats/caps/headbands in buildings; belt buckles larger than 2 inches; visible tattoos; earrings; make-up; fad haircuts or hair colors; sweatshirts/hoodies that are not Westfield

Appearance: Hair should not be below the bottom of the ear, not below the eyebrow nor extend below the top of the collar. Boys must be clean shaven. Hair must be neat, well-groomed and not extreme in color or style. Fad haircuts or hair colors are not allowed.

Other: Sunglasses may not be worn indoors. Caps, bandanas, visors, head scarves, and hats are not permitted to be worn in buildings.

MIDDLE & UPPER SCHOOL GIRLS

Shirts/Blouses: Shirts/Blouses must have a traditional button up front with traditional button at the neckline, must be cotton or cotton blend material – NO sheer or silk materials – long or short sleeves, with no more than the top button unbuttoned, or collared polo-type shirt, solid color or stripe, long or short sleeves, with no more than top button unbuttoned, or mock turtleneck or turtleneck. Logos must be no larger than 2" square. Shirts may not be worn as jackets. Shirts may be worn un-tucked if length is sufficient to cover midriff and waist at all times.

Pants: Pants must be solid color and normal fit, without elasticized or draw-string waist; must be neat, clean, and hemmed; must not contain holes, frays, or patches. Belts must be worn with pants and which have belt loops. All pants must fit properly and modestly.

Jeans: Jeans must be solid color and normal fit, without elasticized or draw-string waist; must be neat and clean without any holes, frays, or patches. Jeans must not have any distressed finish (tears, holes, cuts,) and washes or fading must not be extreme. Fad finishes are not allowed. Jeans may be unhemmed but must not be torn or have loose threads at hem. Belts must be worn with jeans which have belt loops. All jeans must fit properly and modestly.

Shorts and Skorts: Shorts and skorts must fit properly and modestly; be of appropriate length, be solid color or plaid and normal fit, without elasticized or draw-string waist; and be neat, clean, and hemmed. Shorts and skorts must not contain holes, frays, or patches. No athletic style shorts.

Not Allowed: Skirts; dresses; Camouflage items; visible tattoos; excessive ear-rings or visible body piercings, fad haircuts or hair colors; hair feathers; jeggings and pajama jeans; tunics worn as tops over leggings; leggings worn as pants; sweatshirts/hoodies that are not Westfield. (Due to the varying styles and necklines of dresses and the difficulty in managing enforcement, skirts and dresses are not included in acceptable school-day attire.)

Footwear: Shoes must have closed toes and heels; modest sandals are allowed; boots may not be worn with shorts or skorts, but may be worn with pants or jeans. Toe shoes, sport sandals, slides, house slippers, shower shoes, and flip-flops are not allowed. Crocs style shoes are allowed.

Appearance: Hairstyles must be neat, well-groomed and not extreme in color and style.

Other: Sunglasses may not be worn indoors. Caps, bandanas, visors, head scarves, and hats are not permitted to be worn in buildings.

ADDITIONAL DRESS CODE REQUIREMENT FOR MIDDLE & UPPER SCHOOL

Every Westfield student in grades 6 through 12 must have required dress items to be worn every Wednesday throughout the school year and also on designated occasions. This attire must be worn on special designated occasions. Westfield monogrammed shirts (white, dark green, and light yellow) must be purchased from the school designated vendors, Lands' End and our online Spirit Shop/Graphic Guys. The shirt must have the word WESTFIELD monogrammed on the front left chest area. Shirts with Westfield athletic logos are not acceptable for required dress. Westfield sweatshirts/hoodies may be worn on required dress days. No other sweatshirts/hoodies may be worn.

Boys: long khaki pants and a collared Westfield white, dark green, or corn monogrammed shirt (oxford or polo type, long or short sleeve). Boys' shirts must be tucked in at all times. Shoes for this required dress must be closed-toe and closed-heel.

Girls: long khaki pants (no capris) or an appropriate length khaki skort and a collared Westfield white, dark green, or light yellow monogrammed shirt (oxford or polo type, long or short sleeve). Shirts may be worn un-tucked if length is sufficient to cover midriff and waist at all times. Skirts may not be worn. Shoes for this required dress must be closed-toe and closed-heel.

AMENDED DRESS CODE FOR FRIDAYS AND OTHER SPECIFIC OCCASIONS

Students may wear Westfield game jerseys or Westfield t-shirts on Fridays only. As a senior privilege, designated "college gear" garments will be allowed for seniors on certain announced days, as determined by the school.

OUTER WEAR FOR LOWER, MIDDLE & UPPER SCHOOL BOYS AND GIRLS

- Sweatshirts and hoodies (Westfield only) may be worn over a collared shirt (or over a Westfield t-shirt on Friday spirit days). No other sweatshirts/hoodies may be worn.
- Solid color pullovers and vests (such as Patagonia, Columbia, Vineyard Vines, etc.) over a collared shirt may be worn.
- Jackets and coats without any wording may be worn.
- **Camouflage outerwear items are not allowed.**
- Westfield approved items from Lands' End (with or without the Westfield monogram) and our online Spirit Shop/Graphic Guys may be worn.

PE UNIFORMS FOR MIDDLE SCHOOL STUDENTS (GRADES 6-8)

Students in grades 6-8 are required to dress out in a Westfield PE uniform each day for their PE class. **Before school begins, each student will need to order one PE uniform set (t-shirt and shorts) from the school's Spirit Shop at no charge by visiting <https://westfieldschool.itemorder.com/> and using the code PE2024. This code may be used only one time per student.** Families may purchase additional PE uniform t-shirts and shorts through the online spirit shop if desired.

School administration and faculty will make all determinations in appropriateness of dress and appearance.
